

Manual and Power Mobility Options - ALS Clinic

This handout is meant to act as an outline of different options for mobility devices, to guide your expectations and to help you identify when you may require a re-assessment for new equipment.

All wheelchairs must be recommended by an occupational therapist (OT) or physiotherapist (PT) to ensure they are properly sized and meet your mobility needs.

Transport Wheelchair



- Available through ALS Canada's Loan Cupboard
- Good for occasional use when fatigued
- Lightweight and foldable; fits in most cars
- Small wheels work best indoors may be "bumpy" outside
- Uncomfortable for long periods of time
- Cannot be independently propelled by user
- No customization possible

Manual Wheelchair



- Available through ALS Canada's Loan Cupboard
- Good for indoor or outdoor use for multiple hours at a time
- Improved comfort for long distances and over uneven ground
- Foldable option requires some disassembly
- May not fit in smaller cars
- OT can request specialized cushion and back support for improved comfort and pressure relief
- Can be independently propelled by a user's hands or feet

Manual Tilt Wheelchair



- Available through ALS Canada's Loan Cupboard
- Best option for all-day indoor or outdoor use
- Tilts back in space for pressure relief and positioning
- OT can request specialized cushion and back support for improved comfort and pressure relief
- Especially helpful with neck or core weakness
- Cannot fold; requires an accessible vehicle for community mobility
- Difficult for user to propel independently



Power Scooter (Outdoor)



- Available through ALS Canada's Loan Cupboard
- Excellent for use outdoors or on somewhat uneven terrain
- Comfortable for several hours of consecutive use
- Allows independent mobility over long distances
- Requires strength in core and both arms/hands to use safely
- Cannot fold; requires an accessible vehicle for transportation

Power Scooter (Indoor)



- Available through ALS Canada's Loan Cupboard
- Excellent for use indoors or on flat terrain
- Allows independent mobility over long distances
- Requires strength in core and both arms/hands to use safely
- May be uncomfortable if used for extended times
- Can be disassembled and transported in most mid-sized vehicles

Basic Power Wheelchair



- Available through ALS Canada's Loan Cupboard
- Excellent for use indoors and outdoors
- Allows independent mobility over long distances
- Some modifications possible for cushion style and fit
- Requires hand and arm strength to use safely
- Unable to recline or tilt may cause discomfort over time
- Requires an accessible vehicle for transportation

Power Wheelchair with Power Positioning



- 75% funding available through the Government of Ontario
- Completely customized to each individual's needs
- Designed for all-day comfort with indoor and outdoor use
- Power positioning features allow independent repositioning
- Drive controls and seating can be modified over time
- Improved comfort for core or neck weakness
- Requires an accessible vehicle for transportation

Other Power Mobility Options

Other power mobility devices (such as portable power wheelchairs) are readily available for purchase at mobility stores or online. However, these devices may not be appropriate for you based on your symptoms, there is no funding available for these devices, and they cannot be obtained through ALS Canada's loan cupboard. Please speak with your OT before purchasing any power mobility device to ensure that it will meet your needs.
